3. What 2 things does verse 5 tell us to get?

5. According to verse 10, what is the benefit of receiving wisdom?

6. According to verse 13, what is the benefit of keeping God's instruction?

8. How does verse 18 describe the path of the just/righteous?

9. What does verses 4:20-22 urge us to do about God's word?

10. According to verse 23, why should we keep our hearts with all Diligence?

11. What does verse 24 say about our speech?

12. What must we do to stay in the right path according to verses 25-27?

Definitions:

- **Discretion:** Prudence, or knowledge and prudence; that discernment which enables a person to judge critically of what is correct and proper, united with caution; (Proverbs 2:11)
- **Knowledge:** Is referring to the knowledge of God. God has perfect knowledge of all His works. (Proverbs 2:10,)
- **Knowledge and Understanding:** Refers to having the understanding of how to apply the knowledge or the wisdom of God in your life. (Proverbs 2:2,3,5,10)
- **Wicked:** Evil in principle or practice; deviating from the divine law; In Scripture, persons who live in sin; transgressors of the divine law; all who are unreconciled to God, unsanctified or impenitent. (Proverbs 2:22)
- **Wisdom:** (Amplified) "comprehensive insight into the ways and purposes of God." (Proverbs 4:11)
